## Agreement on an Corporate/Institutional Membership between the "European Association of Methodology" (EAM) and the "Gesellschaft für Klassifikation e.V." (GfKl)

In view of good scientific and personal relations, as an expression of the mutual appreciation of their activities, and in order to support and deepen scientific contacts and cooperation between their members, the "European Association of Methodology" (EAM) and the "Gesellschaft für Klassifikation e.V." (GfKl) establish herewith a

## Corporate/Institutional Membership

of the following form:

- 1. The EAM becomes a ,corporate member' of the GfKl as a scientific Society affiliated to the GfKl.
- 2. The GfKl becomes an 'institutional member' of the EAM.
- 3. The objective of this mutual corporate/institutional membership is to get informed, in both Societies, about the activities and developments of the other Society and to establish some firm institutional and personal contact in order to facilitate the scientific cooperation and to foster joint activities.
- 4. Each Society assigns two of their members as their representatives in the other Society: These representatives will obtain regularly all information material of the other Society (internal newsletters, conference announcements, circulars etc.) and will circulate it within their own Society if considered to be appropriate.
- 5. This corporate/institutional membership is free of dues for both. Hence, each Society has the right to send one of their members as a guest to the Annual General Assembly of the other one, if desired.
- 6. Two members of each Society may become a regular (personal or natural) member of the other society which is free of dues for these members and for the other Society.
- 7. At the scientific conferences of the other Society each regular (personal or natural) member of both Societies is granted the same fee reductions as the regular members of the organizing Society.

This agreement becomes effective on November 2, 2005, for an indefinite period. Cancellation must be declared in written form to the President of the EAM or to the President of the GfKl, respectively, at a six months notice before the end of a calendar year.
