

Voting rules for the EAM Executive Committee (EC)

(Proposal of Johannes Hartig / Rolf Steyer April 27, 2006)

1. The election of the Executive Committee (EC) can be held at a Members Assembly, by letters, or by electronically submitted votes.
2. Elections are chaired and organised by an EAM member who is not a candidate for one of the offices in the EC. This chair person is appointed by the Executive Committee (majority vote) of the EAM.
3. Candidates for each office of the EC, except for the four committee members, have to be nominated separately.
4. Candidates for the EC have to be members of the EAM.
5. To be nominated for an office in the EC, each candidate needs to be supported by at least two other EAM members.
6. It is possible for one candidate to run for more than one office in the EC, but it is not possible to accept more than one office in the EC.
7. For each position, the candidate with the relative majority of votes is elected.
8. In case a candidate is elected for more than one office in the EC, he or she has to accept one of the offices at the end of the election.
9. When a candidate is elected for more than one office in the EC and has chosen one of the offices, the candidates with the second most votes are elected for the offices rejected by the first candidate.
10. Each voter has one vote for the president, one for the vice-president, one for the general secretary, one for the treasurer and one for the deputy general secretary. Each voter has *four* votes for the four committee members.
